







1	airstream	corriente de aire		A movement of air, especially a strong one.
2	antidepressant	antidepresivo	x 	A drug used to treat depression.
3	apnea	apnea		A condition in which sb stops breathing temporarily while they are sleeping.
4	atonia	atonía		Loss of muscle tone, lack of muscle tone.
5	behavior	comportamiento		The manner of behaving
6	breathing	respiración	x 	The action of taking air into the lungs and sending it out again.
7	cataplexy	cataplexia o cataplejía		Temporary paralysis
8	device	aparato/artefacto	x 	An object or a piece of equipment that has been designed to do a particular job.
9	disease	enfermedad	x 	Illness, sickness

10	eeg (electroencephalography )	electroencefalografía	x 	An instrument for measuring and recording the electric activity of the brain.
11	hallucination	alucinación	x 	The fact of seeming to see or hear sb/sth that is not really there.
12	hormone	hormona	x 	A chemical that the body releases that affects how certain organs or tissues grow or develop.
13	hypnagogic hallucination	alucinación hipnagógica		visual, tactile, auditory, or other sensory events, that occur at the transition from wakefulness to sleep.
14	insomnia	insomnio	x 	The condition of being unable to sleep.
15	limb	extremidad/miembro	x 	One of the paired bodily parts of animals, used esp. for moving or grasping.

16	narcolepsy	narcolepsia		A condition characterized by frequent and uncontrollable periods of deep sleep.
17	orexin	Orexina		Neuropeptide that regulates arousal, wakefulness, and appetite.
18	REM	movimientos oculares rápidos	x 	Rapid Eye Movement (describes a period of sleep during which you dream and your eyes make many small movements)
19	sedatives	sedante	x 	A drug that makes sb go to sleep or makes them feel calm and relaxed.
20	throat	garganta	x 	A passage in the neck through which food and air pass on their way into the body.
21	to collapse	colapsar		To fall in and become flat or empty.
22	to disrupt	interrumpir		To make it difficult for sth to continue in the normal way
23	to strike	dar		To happen suddenly and have a harmful or damaging effect on sb/sth
